If however, no substitute can be found, the Scout (and his Parents) will still be responsible for the Scouts portion of the Summer Camp Program and any applicable travel expenses. In general the following reasons are acceptable cause for a refund: Summer School, Family Relocation, Doctors Medical Excuse, or Death in Family.
