Typical Camping Schedule

In any given year our typical camping schedule includes Fishing, Caving, Backpacking, Indoor Climbing, skiing, Off-road Biking, Rafting, Game weekends and Wilderness Survival. Most of the areas that we use for these activities are no further than 3 hours driving time.

For our summer camp we spend 8 days at Camp Russell, in Woodgate, NY. The scouts can earn a variety of Merit Badges, consisting of water, camping, skills, crafts, and mature conservation.

Fund Raising

Parents need not worry about footing a large financial bill for these programs. We operate different fund raisers throughout the year to help pay for these activities. These include Poinsettia sales, Popcorn Sales, our annual Spaghetti Dinner and a few other great ideas to help support this active schedule.
